

### Q: What are x-rays?



A: X-Rays are a type of radiation that when transmitted through a body or object, produces an image of what is inside!



### Q: What are x-rays used for?





A: X-rays are used to help physicians diagnose and treat disease and injury.



### What is Medical Radiography?

- It is the art and science of producing medical images using x-radiation
- A Medical Radiation Technologist produces images that a radiologist interprets to aid in diagnosing a patient

 Prepares graduates for advanced training and education in imaging specialties such as CT, Breast Imaging, Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)



# Things you should know about the day-to-day practice of a medical radiography technologist:

- it is a physically demanding job, requiring you to push wheelchairs and stretchers, transfer patients, maneuver mobile x-ray equipment, and more
- medical imaging departments see millions of patients each year in BC, requiring technologists to work efficiently while ensuring patient care and safety
- technologists provide imaging services in a variety of patient care settings, including the operating room, emergency department, and more
- some roles require technologists to perform venipuncture for the purpose of intravenous contrast injection (e.g. during a CT scan)
- technology is constantly evolving, which means professionals have an ongoing personal responsibility to continuously learn and adapt



### Role of the Radiographer

As part of their professional duty, technologists:

- EXPLAIN procedures to patients.
- ANSWER questions as fully as possible.
- CONTRIBUTE to patient education.
- COMFORT patients and provide emotional support.
- POSITION patients and equipment correctly.
- ENSURE that patient, all staff and visitors are protected from radiation.
- MONITOR patients during the procedure.
- ASSIST the radiologist for angiographs and interventional procedures.
- OPERATE the equipment.



# COMPETENCY PROFILE (SKILLS OF) RADIOLOGICAL TECHNOLOGY

- The *National Competency Profile for Entry-Level Medical Radiation Technologists* (*MRTs*) in *Canada* describes the practice requirements of MRTs at entry-to-practice, to provide safe, effective, compassionate and ethical patient care in a variety of work environments.
- This profile is developed by the Canadian Association of Medical Radiation
  Technologists (CAMRT). It provides a guide for program curriculum and is used to
  develop a blueprint for the CAMRT national certification examination

### Accreditation





The Camosun Medical Radiography Program is registered and accredited under Accreditation Canada's <u>EQual program</u>. Health Education Accreditation is a quality improvement process that supports the program in ensuring that graduates are ready to deliver quality care at entry to practice.

The Medical Radiography Program is currently accredited with condition until June 2027.



### The MRAD Program

- Intense 24 months of study (including summer terms)
- 6 consecutive terms in total
- Alternating academic terms and clinical practicums (visit camosun.ca/dates)
- During academic terms, classes run 5 days per week with a mix of classroom, lab/simulation activities, and online learning.
- Clinical terms include 4 hospital shifts (including possible evenings and weekends) plus one academic day per week.
- This program is a full time commitment!



### School of Health & Human Services (HHS)

- Camosun College offers more than 15 health and human services programs, including a degree, post-degree diploma, certificates, diplomas and university transfer courses.

- Our goal is to educate students to create "flourishing individuals, families, and communities".




### Clinical Experience

- Clinical placements will be at a variety of sites on Vancouver Island
- There is no guarantee that students will receive their preferred placements
- Students are responsible for providing their own transportation and accommodations while on their clinical placement; keep these costs in mind

### **Admission Process Overview**

- Complete your online application between September
   15 December 15, 2024
- Complete your document submissions by <u>January 10</u>, 2025
- Complete your non-academic assessment (Casper test)
  within the assigned window. Admissions will provide
  you with instructions once you've qualified.
  - MRAD Casper test dates typically run from October-February for each application cycle



### **Admission Process Overview**

- Students are ranked.
  - Fifty percent of each student's rank comes from their GPA of the admission requirements <u>only</u>, no other grades are used in the calculation.
  - Fifty percent of each student's rank comes from their non-academic assessment (Casper test score).
- Up to 16 of the top ranked students receive an invitation to participate in the clinical site placement process and are offered a seat\*

\*you will be asked for a \$175.00 deposit to hold a seat; the deposit goes towards your first semester tuition but is non-refundable if you change your mind.



### **Admission Process Overview**

- The program maintains a short waitlist for late entry into the same year due to student withdrawals or deferrals. Waitlists are not retained for future years.
- Applicants who do not get a seat in the year of their application need to reapply in order to be eligible in a subsequent year.
- Applicants will have to re-take the non-academic assessment in each application year cycle.
- You only have to take it once per application year for all AHT programs at Camosun. The assessment company will send your results to multiple schools for a small fee.



### **Admission Requirements**

- English 12 (B = 73%)\*
- Math 12 (B − 73%)\*
- Physics 12 (B = 73%)\*
- Biology 12 (B = 73%)\*
- Medical Terminology (B = 73%)\*

Academic courses **MUST** be completed within the last 5 years\*\*

### **Admission Requirements**

### Required for your online application by January 10, 2025

A completed Physical Requirements Form (this can be filled out online)

- Attend an MRAD Information Session & complete online questionnaire. <u>Be sure you do the survey!</u>
- 40 hrs <u>volunteer work</u> in a patient related environment (interactive role)



### Tips for Meeting Volunteer Requirement

- Volunteering must be relevant to your future role and include direct interactions with patients or clients (e.g. activity volunteers, assisting patients or clients with mobility issues, assisting patients to move between rooms, etc.)
- The best environment is within an institutional care setting (such as a hospital or long-term care facility)
- Individuals having prior relevant work experience (e.g. health care assistants or other healthcare professionals) may submit a letter of recommendation form in lieu of the volunteer requirement. This letter must be provided by a direct supervisor confirming their role and responsibilities performed in lieu of the volunteer hours.
- Some facilities ask that you commit to a regular volunteer shift for a minimum time commitment (e.g. Island Health typically expects 2-4 hours per week for a minimum of 6 months). - You may be required to meet certain requirements to volunteer, including proof of immunizations and a Criminal Records Check (these are also program requirements)

### **Admission Requirements**

### After your Academic Requirements have been Assessed and Qualified:

- You will receive registration and scheduling instructions for their non-academic assessment.
- Students may take the assessment one time per application cycle and must do so within the prescribed timeframe indicated by the program.
- Students applying to other Allied Health & Technologies programs at Camosun College need only take the assessment once per application cycle.

### **Admission Requirements**

### After all applicants have completed the non-academic assessment:

- An aggregate score for each applicant is calculated by <u>equally</u> <u>weighting</u> the academic (combined GPA of admission requirements) and non-academic assessment scores to determine which applicants will receive program seat invitations.
- Once all aggregated scores are totaled, the students selected will be offered seats in the program for a given year, pending completion of the Program Participation Requirements (deadline varies by requirement).



### Program Waitlist

- The program maintains a short waitlist for late entry into the same year due to student withdrawals or deferrals.
- Waitlists are not retained for future years.
- Those applicants meeting the admission requirements, but not gaining a seat in the year of application need to reapply in order to be eligible in a subsequent year.



### **Program Participation Requirements**

### DO NOT begin these before being offered a seat!

- Students must accept assigned clinical site placements, subject to availability and capacity.
- Students must provide their own transportation, meals, and accommodations while completing their clinical placement(s).
- Students must have yearly respirator mask 'fit-testing' done. Students will be responsible for completing this process prior to the first clinical experience and for any associated costs.
- Current BLS (Basic Life Support) is required prior to the start of all clinical placements. Annual recertification of BLS must be maintained throughout the program. Students will be responsible for the cost of this certification.



### Program Participation Requirements, cont.

- Students must provide evidence of their immunizations or immunity to preventable, communicable diseases.
- Students are highly recommended to maintain current immunizations as per the <u>Practice Education Guidelines of B.C.</u> Successful applicants should gather their immunization records as soon as possible after accepting a seat in the program.
- Failure to comply with immunization guidelines could result in the health care organization or the College barring the individual from the clinical/practicum setting until proof of immunity is provided and/or until a communicable disease outbreak is declared over. This could impact a student's ability to successfully complete the clinical/practicum placement and/or a clinical/community rotation.

### Investing in your future:

### **Cost of Schooling:**

- $$40,713 \div 6 \text{ Terms} = about $6,786/term}$
- \$6,786 ÷ 4 Months (per term) = about **\$1,697/month**
- About \$424/week, \$85/day or about \$12/hour

### **Income Potential at full time\*:**

- \$60,255 \$76,500/year @ 37.5 hrs/week
- Earning about \$5,021 \$6,375/month
- \$30.90/hr \$40/hr




